Manse Minute

This morning we begin a series of short informational "tidbits" about our church's Manse. Stay tuned through the remainder of the spring and throughout the summer for interesting historical information about the home we are renovating.

The Swift Bodfish house was built for 23 or 24-year-old Capt. William Bodfish (II) around 1814 for his young wife, Deborah Hatch, and their two-year-old daughter, Mary. Another child, William III, was born shortly after in 1815. Capt. Bodfish was a talented sea captain, or "Master" as they were called, who must have had some local fame as he was reputed to be the "youngest man to attain the full rank of master of a large Cape ship." The house was built in the Middle Georgian style with 4 chimneys, 13 rooms, a central "ships stairway," and certainly was among the most impressive home in Falmouth at the time. The Falmouth Historical Society's Wicks/Julia Wood home next door is a similar style built about 15 years earlier, around 1797.


