

## **Manse Minute #4**

During the renovation, several interesting historic details have been revealed. First, in the center of the house is a 15foot-deep well, now dry. This may have been a "winter well," used to avoid bringing water in from the outside during the coldest parts of the year. Also, the small room (or rooms) on the NW corner of the house appears to pre-date the rest of the house with small-paned windows from the mid-1700's and framing done in an 18th-century style. This room was likely a laundry room with a place for a large laundry cauldron over a brick stove and markings on the wall that may have been from splashed lye soap used for cleaning clothes. We have been told by a visiting historian that this is one of two existing laundries in Massachusetts from the mid-1700's. Also, at one spot in the floor is a painted or stenciled design, very badly worn, from the early 1800's that is rare, but not salvageable.
