### **Manse Minute #5**

Why do we call it the Swift Bodfish House the "Manse"? A manse, according the dictionary, can either mean a large, stately or imposing residence or "A cleric's house and land, especially the residence of a Presbyterian minister". The term Manse is common in England and in Scotland as a minister's residence. When a Manse moved out of ownership from the church or was a converted to another function another adjective was added to distinguish it from the home of the Minister. Nathaniel Hawthorn's short story "the Old Manse" about a former parsonage in Concord is an example of this. Perhaps a more common proper term for the Manse today might be a "parsonage" meaning, of course, the home of the parson. Prior to our purchase of the Manse around 1960, the church owned a building on Palmer Avenue occupied by the minister and did call it the parsonage. That building, sold in 1967 and now gone, was located near where Katherine Lee Bates Road meets Palmer Avenue. So it is a bit of an oddity that when that house was abandoned by the church and that function was moved to the Manse that the term parsonage did not move with it.
