Manse Minute #6

As noted earlier, Oliver Cromwell Swift, (1797-1874) and family lived in the manse from about 1825 until his death in 1874. He was married to Eliza Robinson Jenkins and had 6 children: Elizabeth, Adeline, Elijah, Permissa, Oliver and Frances. Like his father Elijah, Oliver was also a businessman and helped bring the Vineyard Sound RR railroad to Falmouth in 1866, started a glass factory, involved in Falmouth's whaling industry and was primarily a ship owner. He was said to be about 6 ft 3 inches tall, "fastidious in habits and dress," yet charitable. His last whale ship, the Commodore Morris, returned from her final voyage in 1864, effectively ending the whaling business in Falmouth. He died at age 76. He was a member of the Congregational Church and "rented" for \$75 (about \$2,000 today) one of the curved pews at the rear of the church near the choir in 1861. He, with others of the Swift family, are buried at Oak Grove Cemetery in Falmouth.
